Montessori School News

Welcome back! I hope your family enjoyed the break and are off to a great start in this New Year.

Learning more about Montessori

The focus of the Montessori system is the development of materials, educational techniques and observations, which support the natural development of children. Children are encouraged to “learn how to learn”, gaining independence and self-confidence.

In the 3-6 year span the child reaches a stage in which repetition and manipulation of the environment are critical to the development of concentration, coordination, independence and a sense of order.

When the child reaches the next stage of development, ages six to nine, the imagination is the key to learning. The classroom can now excite the child by using this increased imagination to explore the universe. Concepts are introduced through hands-on materials that encourage and engage the child and assist in an understanding of concepts.

As the child enters the next phase, nine to twelve, the world is an ever-expanding place. Concepts may be presented and abstracted with fewer materials. Projects become more involved and diverse in nature.

Except for the kindergarten, Gulfport Montessori classrooms are multi-age groupings. This allows a greater flexibility in meeting each child’s individual needs and permits the child to develop with fewer social transitions.

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Girls on the Run is Coming to Gulfport Elementary!

Girls on the run is a 12-week, after-school program for girls in grades 3-5. GOTR meets twice a week in small groups of 8-20 girls with two female coaches. Participants are taught life skills such as standing up to peer pressure, teamwork, and how to connect with and impact the community and the world. Running is used to inspire and motivate the girls, as well as encourage lifelong health and fitness and build confidence through accomplishment. At the conclusion of the season the girls will participate in a celebratory, non-competitive 5k race, giving them a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals.

GOTR will meet Mondays and Wednesdays after school beginning February 1. If you are a parent or guardian of a girl in the third, fourth or fifth grade you should have received a flyer and registration form. Attn: Mentors, Tutors, Volunteers

"Over the past three years, Pinellas County Schools has trained and matched students with over 2,250 mentors. Mentors help improve a young's person's self-esteem. Youths who meet regularly with their mentors are 46% less likely than their peers to start using illegal drugs and 27% less likely to begin using alcohol. Mentors teach young people how to relate well to all kinds of people and help them strengthen communication skills." A special thank you to Mr. Ron Diner who continuously promotes the Mentoring Program throughout Pinellas County. He is responsible for pairing our school with mentors from Stetson School of Law.

In addition to mentors, volunteers and tutors have added to our student's academic performance. They constantly help with reading and math skills. Thank you to members of Pasadena Community Church and Eckerd College students who serve as tutors and mentors, as well as many parents and retired educators who take time from their busy schedules to work with our students.

Our reading dogs provide stress-free opportunities for our students to improve their reading skills. Our reading dogs include Mr. Silva and Max and Abbey, Ms. Hooper and Ruger, Mr. Spencer and Doofus, Ms. Mirth and Boo, Mr. and Mrs. Legge and Mindy, Ms. Savage and Daisy, Ms. Waterstatt & Trixie, Ms. Allen and Sadie, and Ms. Salusti and Calypso. Many lessons in addition to reading skills are learned from our four-legged tutors.

Lawyers for Literacy provide a tutoring opportunity for our third graders to improve their reading skills in time for the spring standardized testing. Tutors from this group are associated with local law firms and several are students at Stetson College.

We have many parents and relatives who help teachers in the classroom and take work home to complete. They often serve as chaperones for field trips and help with special classroom activities. Their services free our teachers to spend more time with students.

Our Parent Teacher Association supports the school with many fun and educational family activities throughout the school year. All funds made from the PTA fundraising efforts are donated to the school.

This year thus far at Gulfport Elementary School mentors, tutors and volunteers number over 100 and have contributed over 3,000 hours to our students. A huge thanks to all of you!

In addition to our many volunteers, we are thankful to have a number of community businesses and organizations who contribute to our school. It is wonderful for our students to know that members of the community support their educational endeavors. The successful Pack-a-Sack sponsored by Pasadena Community Church and the Gulfport community sponsored School Supply Drive are only two of the several organizations who directly contribute to the well-being of our students. * Just a reminder to **please log your volunteer hours**. The last date to enter hours for the first semester is January 5, 2015. If it is more convenient or if you are having difficulty logging your hours from your home computer, you may log your hours on the sign-up sheet in the front office. These will be entered for you.

Here are a few reasons we are asked to record volunteer hours:

- * The Principals, School Advisory Committees, the Superintendent and the Pinellas County School Board review Year-to-Date totals.
- * The data is reviewed for family and community engagement and how it supports academic achievement.
- * The data is reviewed to determine the direct impact on student achievement.
- * The information can be used when the school is being audited by the State.
- * The School Advisory Committee can use this information as a gage on how welcoming a school is to the community and families.
- * Hours are reported to the Department of Education. This information is compared with other districts and states.
- * The hours determine whether a school is eligible for the DOE Golden School Award.
