MERIT SEMI-FINALISTS NAMED

National Merit Semifinalists: Seven SPHS seniors, all IB students, were named as National Merit Scholarship semifinalists by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. They will be eligible to compete for more than 8,300 scholarships valued at \$34 million that will be offered next spring.

The semifinalists were selected from a pool of 1.5 million high school students taking the 2010 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test. These winners represent less than one percent of the total United States 2012 graduating seniors. The SPHS semifinalists are:

WELCOME TO OUR NEW IB FACULTY!

The IB Program is delighted to introduce four new faculty members this year. You'll see two common themes—previous ties to St. Petersburg High, and a love of animals!

While <u>Kristie Delk</u> (History) is new to the IB Program, she's a familiar face at St. Petersburg High. She taught four years in the traditional program, and she also serves as the varsity softball coach. She hails from Cedar Lake, Indiana (about 40 miles south of Chicago) and received her B. A. in History and Master of Arts in Teaching from Olivet Nazarene University in Bourbonnais, IL.

Prior to teaching, Ms. Delk served as a collegiate softball coach at Olivet Nazarene and Eckerd College. She is married to Jason Delk, a commercial lender, and they have a 3-year old son, Jace Walker Delk. They also have two Dachshunds, Phoebe and Brewster. 
