Do you know who Maria Montessori was? She was a woman ahead of her time. She was the first woman in Italy to graduate from medical school. From observing how young children interact with their world, she developed her philosophy and materials. The materials we use in our classrooms were designed to lead the child to an understanding of complex ideas by going from concrete material use to paper and pencil work. Her writings continue to be a resource the Gulfport staff can revisit to keep us on track with the Montessori Method. The teachers and staff at Gulfport Elementary invite each of you to stand with us as we share this year's message – A HEALTHY ME IS DRUG FREE! As parents and educators, we are some of the most important role models in the lives of children. During this week, we have a great opportunity to take the time to talk with our children about the harmful effects of alcohol and drugs and to show our commitment to a drug free lifestyle.

Plan a route in advance- Stick to paths that you and your child are familiar with to avoid getting lost.
 Wear comfy shoes- Make sure you and your children are in comfortable, well-fitting shoes.

3. Stay well-lit. - Apply reflective tape to your child's costume to ensure they are seen by drivers on the road.

Also, carry a flashlight with you to keep your child's path lit at all times.

4. Make sure all costumes are appropriate length and tit well- long costumes can be a tripping hazard especially at night

5. Avoid masks - Masks can make it difficult for your child to see or breathe. If possible, skip the mask altogether and use non-toxic make-up to complete the costume instead

6. **Use flexible props**- Try to avoid costames that have weapons as accessories. But if your child's costame won't be complete without a weapon, make sure it is rubber or plastic. Choose a prop that won't cause injury to your child or their friends.

### <u>Listen To Your Kid</u>

Children expect their parents to take them seriously and listen to what they are saying.

\* Listen to your kid without being judgmental.

\* Understand his point of view and reasoning.

\* If you do not agree to something, discuss with him what your concerns are.

\* Do not make it into a blame game.

\* Support and encourage him. If required, tell him that what he did was not good, but you still love him.

#### Instill Confidence in Your Kid:

As a parent, you are the main source of instilling confidence in your child.

\* If your child has faced a first day at school, ask him or her about the school.

\* Ask them what was taught and if he liked the teacher.

\* Ask about any new friend your child may have made.

\* Though making friends immediately is not an easy task, you can improve his or her confidence and prepare to face the new school in a better way.
