### **ADDRESS CHANGE**

Moving or planning to move??According to the Code of Student Conduct, if you move during the school year or in the summer months, parents are required to give the school their new address within five days of their move. If the school discovers that you have moved and you have not informed the school, your child could be considered to be "found out of that school's attendance area." This could mean an immediate change of school for your child. Follow these easy steps to update your address and keep the district informed. Please be sure to provide updated phone numbers to us as well. These are extremely important in case of a child's illness or other emergency. *Steps to change your child's address*:

#### Proof of Residence

Requires <u>two</u> of the following items: utility bill for power, water, cable, sewer, or land-based telephone (not cellular); rental agreement or lease; closing document; Pinellas County tax statement including homestead exemption. These items must be recent and include the name of the parent/guardian and the service/home address.

### Summer Learning Strategies

As we enter the Summer Break, I would like to highly encourage everyone to take every opportunity to read with your students and incorporate basic math skill fluency into your daily summer activities. Compelling research shows that the greatest loss of knowledge occurs over the summer and that the best remedy is to routinely make literacy a priority, while at the same time giving equal attention to Math. Studies have shown that the greatest loss for literacy over the summer occurs is with spelling and for math it is computation and factual skills. Addressing spelling accuracy and math computation will help to maintain the factual and procedural knowledge gained in the classroom. A great math resource that will provide you with age appropriate math skill ideas can be found at http://www.mathfactcafe.com/. This resource will generate materials that address everything from basic math facts, to money, to multiplication activities. The site even gives you multiple ways to tailor the activities for your students.

## **Summer Technologies**

I am excited to announce that many of the educational technologies your students have come to enjoy will be available over the summer. Both ST Math and iStation for reading have proven to be valuable learning and teaching tools. To date in ST Math, 39% of our students have completed their grade level syllabus, however that does not mean there is not more to do. There are many challenges and optional activities that have been opened up so that your children can continue with JiJi over the summer. The other resource, iStation, provides targeted and engaging reading interventions to move all students forward regardless of reading level. iStation is designed to be used with pre-K through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students and will allow students to read and work on reading skills beyond their current grade level.

For those parents who find the beloved penguin JiJi quite endearing and intriguing, Mind Research, the company behind ST Math is offering two different apps for your mobile devices. One is called *KickBox* and the other is called *BigSeed*. Both of these apps are a multistep thinking game drawing on the concept of problem solving without the use of words.

As many are aware, state testing results will not be available for several weeks. Once we have received scores from the state we will communicate with you regarding the results from the administration of FSA this year.
