

The Referendum strengthens reading, art and music programs, provides up-to-date technology, and helps recruit and retain quality teachers. Voters overwhelmingly supported the Referendum three times, including its initial approval in 2004. An independent citizens committee oversees Referendum expenditures to ensure money is spent as voters intended. The Referendum costs the average single-family homeowner less than \$5.50 a month. Please avoid calling the front office after 2:20pm. Dismissal is at 2:35pm and employees are processing requests to make sure students know where they are going when school is out.

In keeping with our mission of Highest Student Achievement for each student, Pinellas County Schools is committed to having qualified and professional educators in all classrooms. There are times when it becomes necessary for a school to use an "out of field" teacher.

As you may know, the "No Child Left Behind" (NCLB) Act defines new standards for teacher quality. Under NCLB, teachers must have a Bachelor's degree and hold a valid teaching certificate from the Florida Department of Education in the grade level/subject area assigned. In addition, our state defines a "highly qualified" teacher as one who demonstrates subject matter knowledge by either passing a state test or majoring in the subject in college. Please be advised that, in all cases, teachers and therapists are selected after careful consideration by the principal in cooperation with school district personnel.

Our Speech and Language Therapist, Sara Keimig, has been hired and her application is being processed. Once her application is processed she will be eligible for certification and in-field. We anticipate her certification being processed with the FLDOE in the next few weeks. Please feel free to contact the school if you have any questions at 727-469-5987.
